PE and Sports Premium Report – 2024/25

What is the PE and Sports Premium?

The government provides additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

The money is provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is allocated to primary school headteachers.

What is the purpose of the grant?

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how to do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with teachers.
- Supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional clubs.
- Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Providing cover to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport.
- Running sports competitions and increasing pupils' participation in school sports.
- Pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

Extra MTA staffing and resources at lunchtimes	£3000	This year we have introduced a wider range of games and activities on the playground. We have also introduced KS1 only football slots, and KS2 girls only slots which have encouraged wider participation among these groups.
Run Club	£1400	Six children have taken part and they talk about the club positively. Teachers report a noticeable improvement in motor skills and an improved attitude to PE in general. These children need a movement break in the afternoon and the teachers report higher engagement in lessons on Run Club days.

Year 6 residential trip	£3700	Subsidising disadvantaged children's fees, and supply cover for staff who attended the trip.
Additional play equipment and resources for the playground	£580	New equipment to support the wider range of games and activities available (basketball, football, end-ball, frisbee and playleader challenges)

*** The Bikeability training has been delivered by school staff in previous years. This year we were able to arrange it through Devon County Council at no cost to the school. Instead of an activities week, we returned to our usual Year 6 residential trip. The funds set aside for both these activities were redirected to subsidise disadvantaged children on the residential, and other costs for covering staff who went on the residential.**

Planned PE and Sports Premium Spending 2024/25

Within our Year 6 cohort 20 out of 23 children are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.

Activity	Cost	Anticipated impact
Membership of South Dartmoor School Sports Partnership	£4750	Continued access to a wide range of CPD and enrichment activities (eg: G&T training, playleader training, inter-school competitions and events, etc)
Subject leader release time	£1000	Accessing and arranging CPD and interschool opportunities, managing equipment stock, accompanying children to events, supporting playleaders, etc.

Supply cover for CPD for subject leader and other staff	£1500	Improved subject knowledge and leadership skills and improved teaching skills in staff leading to improved progress for children.
Year 6 residential	£3000	To support families in sending children to experience the city of London. Release time and supply to cover staff who are on the trip.
Year 4 residential	£2000	To support families in sending children to experience activities such as abseiling, mountain biking, caving, etc. Release time and supply to cover staff who are on the trip.
Equipment for after-school clubs, DPA and playleader activities	£1000	Replacing lost and damaged equipment to allow a broad provision of extra-curricular activities.
OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) project	£2375	First part of the costs to introduce the OPAL project at breaks and lunchtimes, to give the children access to OAA and other physical activities on the playground.
Swimming sessions	£1375	Extra swimming sessions. These sessions will be run by 2 qualified swimming coaches and so will be valuable CPD for staff.
