










Three Bears





THE PRIME AREAS:

Communication & Language

2-year olds: I can use single words in play, I can understand frequently used words and simple instructions 3-4 year olds: I can ask simple questions, I can use vocabulary around feelings, I can name familiar objects, I can use new vocabulary in my role-play

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

2-year olds: I am beginning to form friendships, I can express a simple need, I am becoming more self-aware 3-4 year olds: I can safely explore the school grounds, I am becoming more independent when finding my belongings This half-term we will also focus on our Jigsaw topic 'Celebrating Differences'.

Physical Development

2-year olds: I can clap my hands to music, I can move myself into different-sized spaces 3-4 year olds: I am developing my ball skills e.g. throwing, I am practising negotiating spaces and skipping, I am becoming more independent when changing/toileting/using cutlery when eating

<u>Literacy</u>

2-year olds: I show a preference for different stories, I can copy specific gestures and actions 3-4 year olds: I can recognise my peg name, I can trace horizontal lines, I show an interest in different stories and story objects

<u>Mathematics</u>

2-year olds: I can attempt to count in everyday contexts (sometimes missing numbers), I am developing my counting like behaviour, I am exploring the capacity of objects

3-4 year olds: I can make simple observations around numbers 1-3 including counting and subitising, I can explore repetition through songs and follow and create simple patterns <u>Understanding the World</u>

2-year olds: I can make comments about what I can see, I can explore materials with different properties and cause and effect toys and repeat actions that have an effect

3-4 year olds: I can talk about my family and experiences with festivals, I can use my senses to talk about seasonal changes, I can explore how different objects work

Expressive Arts & Design

2-year olds: I can explore painting with body parts, I can learn new rhymes and songs 3-4 year olds: I can explore a variety of materials and tools for junk modelling and mark making and traditional tales through role-play experiences
