

Maths



Children will continue to develop their understanding of addition and subtraction whilst practicing different methods for these to deepen their knowledge of the concepts. They will become more confident to work with 2-digit numbers.

They will then move onto a geometry unit where they will know the properties of shapes such as how many sides, edges or corners. They will also look at lines of symmetry.

History



Children will learn all about the history of nursing, particularly focusing on the work of the trailblazers; Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell. They will discover what it was like to look after soldiers in WWI and the Crimean war and compare this to modern day nursing.

Creative Arts



Children will be inspired by the work of Paul Klee to practice the techniques he used to create their own collages of Florence Nightingale.

We will come together with Year 1 to rehearse and perform our Christmas production.

English



Children will continue to develop their use of correct sentence structure and punctuation whilst writing diary entries in the character of Florence Nightingale.

They will continue to use adventurous adjectives to support their description of nouns when writing Christmas poetry.

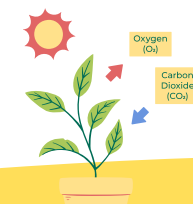
Reading and spelling will continue to be taught during Read Write Inc sessions.

Geography



Our curriculum enrichment week will be Geography themed this half term. The focus will be on sustainability

Science



Children will continue learning about Animals including Humans by looking more in-depth at the basic needs of humans. They will explore the effects of diet and exercise on human health as well as thinking about general hygiene and teeth brushing.

PE



Children will continue to develop the skills needed to play a range of team games. They will also learn new gymnastics skills and use these to build short routines.

Computing



Route Explorers: This unit allows children to code using the tool, 2Go. Children learn to build simple algorithms to move a screen turtle along routes. They consider direction and distances and create commands.

They will also think about online safety.
